Drive, Chip, and Putt Competition

- Players will compete within their own Divisions
- Players must compete in all three stations of the Competition in order to be eligible for the Overall Championship within their own Division
- Only ties for “Overall” places will be decided by a “putt-off”

Points System

Drive Station	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Each player hits two drives• The longest of the two drives will be recorded as their score• Only drives “in bounds” count <p><i>Tie-Breaker: none, points divided evenly</i></p>
Chipping Station	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Each player hits three chips• Points are awarded for each chip based on how close it is to the hole• 10 points awarded for a “holed” chip• Points from all three chips are totaled <p><i>Tie-Breaker: number of “holed” chips, if none, points divided evenly</i></p>
Putting Station	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Hole # 1 (5 foot putt)<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Record the number putts required to “hole” out the ball• Hole # 2 (15 foot putt)<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Measure the distance from the cup after the first putt○ Record the number of putts required to “hole” out the ball• Putts from both holes are totaled <p><i>Tie-Breaker: Distance of first putt on Hole #2</i></p>
Overall Score	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Each player is given a score based on how they finish in each event:<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ 1st Place = 1 point○ 2nd Place = 2 points• Total up scores from the three events• Player with the lowest score wins
