

Announcing a Reciprocal Agreement Between the JGAA and the SAJGA



Paying your annual membership fee to either the Junior Golf Association of Arizona, JGAA, or the Southern Arizona Junior Golf Association, SAJGA, gets you the full benefits* of both organizations. This agreement furthers the mission of both organizations to make golf opportunities more accessible to juniors.

What does this mean for you?

If you live in Southern Arizona, join or renew your membership in the SAJGA (www.SAJGA.org). This applies to most all current SAJGA members. Let your JGAA membership, if you have one, lapse. You can still play in as many JGAA events as you like, but now you do not have to pay the extra membership fee. If you have not tried playing a JGAA event, you can do so by only paying the applicable tournament cost.

If you live anywhere else in Arizona, join or renew your membership in the JGAA (www.JGAA.org). Let your SAJGA membership, if you have one, lapse. If you would like to try an SAJGA event, you can do so without having to pay any additional membership fee.

If you don't live in Arizona, you can join either organization and get the full benefits* of both.

*Full benefits means everything – Player of the Year eligibility and all other benefits of membership. You can play in tournaments of both organizations while only paying one membership fee. To play in tournaments, you must take a rules clinic from the JGAA, SAJGA or Ricki Rarick. You must pass the JGAA online rules test prior to competing in JGAA summer tournaments. You must pass the SAJGA online rules test to play in SAJGA tournaments (for 13-14 and 15-18 Divisions only). More details can be found on each organization's website.
